## 2012 is a Year of Celebrations

There are the Olympics being held in the summer.

2012 comes just 1200 years after the death of St Kenelm.

And of course, the Queen’s Diamond Jubilee on the first weekend in June.



For us in the Church we have a particular reason to celebrate the Jubilee because of the quality of Christian service the Queen has brought to everything. **“When I ascended the throne I dedicated my life to the service of my peoples, and I asked almighty God to assist me in this great enterprise. That was in the Salad Days of youth, but I would not now take back one word of it”.** So said her Majesty at a previous Jubilee.

This is surely one of the main reasons why, despite all the troubles of the Royal Family, she continues to be sincerely loved throughout our nation.

She is continuing the example set by her father, who at the start of WWII quoted the poem:

**I said to the man who stood at the Gate of the Year,  
“Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown.”  
And he replied, “Go out into the darkness, and put your hand into the hand of God.  
That shall be to you better than light, and safer than a known way.”**  
And the King added,  
**“May that Almighty Hand guide and uphold us all.”**

St Kenelm’s are keen to join with other parish organisations in this great weekend, and are delighted that the Village Hall Trustees are offering the whole complex free of charge for a day. ## Charity Collections

At **HARVEST** we raised **£98** to help work with homeless people in Worcester.

In **October** the retiring collection in memory of Ted Hooper was **£223** for St Michael's Hospice.

The **REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY** (Poppy Day Collection) in the service at St Kenelm's came to **£351**.

At **CHRISTMAS** we had the **Big Sing-In** for Christian Aid on December 9<sup>th</sup>, which raised **£ 210** (plus £100-worth of Traidcraft sales).

**Carol singing** in The Lion and The New Inn and the Christmas Morning service collection raised a total of **£125** again for homeless people in Worcester (St Paul's Hostel).

The **Christingle Service** collection for The Children's Society was **£ 97**

THANK YOU, too, for the many **face flannels** donated for the Morning Star children's AIDS centre in S. Africa.



**Christian Aid week** is **May 13th to 19th** this year.

## We are a Charity Too....

Contrary to popular thinking, we have never had state funding. And for many reasons, the Church Commissioners' contributions have been shrinking rapidly over recent decades, so that more and more we have to pay all our own expenses, just like a Scout or Guide group.

Now that we have completed some brilliant renovations to the church and its heating system at a total cost of well over £125,000, we are setting about the business of knocking our on-going finances into shape. More of this later in the year.
