TEME VALLEY MAN IN 150 MILE SAHARA DESERT RACE

A local man is set to pit himself against a gruelling six-day desert race in the Moroccan Sahara to raise money for three charities.

Patrick Timmis, who grew up in the Teme Valley and whose parents live in Shelsley, moved to Casablanca, Morocco with his wife just after they got married in September 2014.

Ranked by the Discovery Channel as the most gruelling foot race on earth, the Marathon des Sables is run in 6 days over a course of 150 plus miles through the Sahara desert: across salt pans, over sand dunes and up desert mountains, all in temperatures reaching up to 50 degrees Celsius!

The rules require you to be self-sufficient, to carry with you everything you need to survive except water. You are given a place in a tent to sleep at night, but any other equipment and food must be carried on your back.

This year's race will start on 9 April and ends on 15 April (Easter Saturday). The exact course of

the race changes every year but the format is the same: the first three days are around 25 miles in length, followed by the dreaded “long day” on 12 April when the competitors will run 50 miles. After one rest day, there is a final marathon stage and a charity stage of around 12 miles to close out the event.

Patrick said: “I heard about the race many years ago and in fact my brother-in-law completed it 10 years ago but I never imagined that I would enter it. However I started running in some longer competitions last year and thoroughly enjoyed it, so I thought – why not?! At first the training was very hard but since January I have joined up with six other competitors from

Casablanca and we train together every Saturday on the dunes and Sunday in the local forest. The preparation is really down to the minute details as you need to take only what you need and plan exactly what you will eat – every gram counts!”

Patrick is running to fundraise for three charities: Parkinson’s research charity The Cure Parkinson’s Trust, children’s cancer charity CLIC Sargent and SOS Children’s Villages which supports abandoned and orphaned children all around the world. 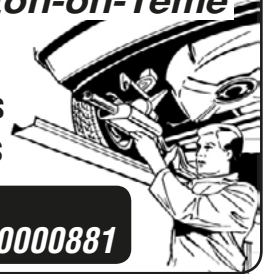

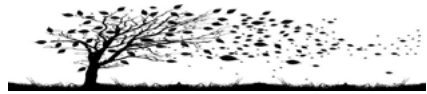

Declaration of Interest:

Councillors Bates and Stinton for Village Hall item 13.

Minutes: The minutes of January 10th 2017 were proposed and seconded and signed as a true record.

Public Question Time: none.

District Councillor's report and County Councillor's Report: These are available in full on the website.

Broadband: Prior to the meeting S Ashton from WCC had informed the clerk there was no update on BT's re-evaluation for providing the Shelsleys' with Superfast Broadband. There is however a newly published Superfast Broadband newsletter with up to date information. It was agreed that each councillor will contact local residents to gain their opinion and permission to forward details to BT and WCC in order to put pressure on providing a Superfast Broadband service. Harriett Baldwin MP will also be written to.

Highways, Footpaths and Lengthsman: The Lengthsman will be asked to weed and tidy New Mill Bridge. Councillors inspected and agreed the worksheet for February.

B 4203 Accidents. Three accidents were reported. It is thought they were due to excessive speed and not the road surface. One between JW Lane and Stanford Village Hall, one near Cheltry Cottages and one by Bird's Green.

The newly painted and renovated railings at New Mill bridge have been repaired.

Wall damaged by contractors. This is not considered to be a Parish Council matter but in order to facilitate the enquiry the clerk will contact Highways.

The Village Hall: Discussion of possible futures for the Village Hall was deferred until May 9th.

Planning: There were no current planning applications to discuss. It was agreed that there would not be a planning group but that members

would respond to applications between meetings via the clerk in a more effective manner.

Clerk's report on urgent decisions. 17/00037/FUL Walcroft Farm erection of barn. The Clerk in consultation with the councillors recommended approval.

Village Clean Up: There is a large amount of litter within the parish and it is some time since the last litter pick. Councillors are of the opinion that MHDC should clear litter and the Clerk will contact MHDC to enquire.

Grants and Donations: One request was received from the Nora Parsons Day Centre. £200 was agreed.

Finance: Payments agreed were: Clerk's salary and expenses. Lengthman's invoice. HMRC Monies received from WCC in respect of repayment for Lengthsman £380.00.

It was agreed to approach Lloyds Bank to enquire about moving the bank account.

Correspondence and Consultations: All items were either emailed to councilors or were available to view at the meeting. No comments on consultations were recorded.

Village Hall Management Committee: A list of maintenance works and fund raising dates to pay for them was presented to the council. A burglar alarm is to be fitted to the hall.

Councillors' Reports and items for future agenda: Pard House Lane. Road condition and excess water across it to be reported to Highways. Councillors would like a site meeting to discuss the problem with Highways. Highways – to be asked about road sweeping.

Annual Parish Meeting: The meeting will be held at 7pm in the Village Hall to be followed by the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council. The meeting concluded at 8.25. The date of the next meeting: May 9th 2017 at 7pm.

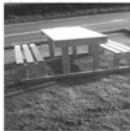

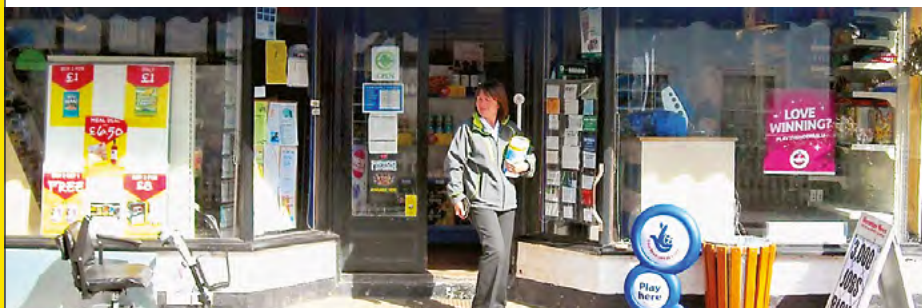
